





## Caring for your Brush

Wipe off excess paint with a cloth and gently squeeze the bristles from the ferrule edge outwards with your fingers to help remove the paint, avoiding pulling too much on the bristles.

When using oils, rinse the brush in turpentine or similar. If using a water-based paint, use lukewarm water. Do not use hot water as this causes the ferrule to expand which will make the hair fall out! Wipe with a cloth again, and then add a little gentle washing up liquid or mild soap. Work up a lather on the brush.

Rinse and repeat the until all the colour has gone. Rinse once more to remove all the soap and shake off the excess water. Shape your brush back into shape gently.


\*Brush charts are a guide and not shown to scale
